Chevening: An investment in the UK's long-term influence

Funded by the UK government and 145+ partners contributing £16.5 million annually, we:

Strengthening global capacity to support international development and advance UK priorities:



Alumni are shaping policy and driving change in sectors aligned with UK priority areas including climate (21%), security (24%), international development (24%), and growth (23%).



88% of alumni apply the skills and knowledge gained in the UK

to drive stability, prosperity and positive change in their home countries.



90% share the knowledge they've learned in the UK with others

Alumni act as ambassadors of UK values and interests

74% have promoted UK values since returning home and 10 alumni are currently serving as UK ambassadors to their home countries.



Almost all alumni have a positive experience in the UK

99% report a positive experience, and 96% say the skills they gained in the UK have advanced their careers, fostering lasting goodwill and engagement with the UK.



Alumni strengthen UK business ties

47% have recommended the UK as a good place for business, and approximately one in ten (12%) have personally conducted business with the UK.

Title: Portugal's Secretary of State for International Trade and Foreign Investment

UK institution: University of Bristol, 2001

Chevening alumnus Bernado Ivo Cruz is strengthening UK-Portugal economic relations at the highest levels of government and business.

During his time as Director of the Portuguese Trade and Investment Agency (AICEP), he co-developed 'Innovating Portugal,' connecting high-growth Portuguese companies with UK investors and industry leaders across priority sectors including renewable energy, digital technologies, and aerospace. The programme supported organisations to expand into the UK, strengthening bilateral trade and investment.

As Secretary of State, he continued to promote UK-Portugal collaboration, encouraging closer economic engagement and new commercial opportunities following the UK's exit from the European Union.

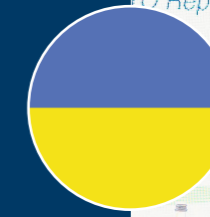


Since 2006, I have connected UK institutions and Portuguese actors. Chevening enabled me to operate across cultures, translate priorities, and build trust-based relationships.

Climate and sustainability

Olesia Kompaniets



Country: Ukraine

UK institution: University College London, International Relations, 2014-15

After completing her Chevening Scholarship, Olesia returned to Ukraine during a critical period of conflict and reform. Over the past decade, she has drawn on her UK education and international networks to strengthen national resilience, support governance reform, and advance Ukraine's ambition for NATO membership.

In her work with NATO's Ukrainian office, Olesia led a professional development programme for government officials responsible for Euro-Atlantic integration, supporting 56 defence and security agencies. This work helped shift institutional approaches to secure senior-level buy-in for reforms aligned with Ukraine's NATO aspirations, in close collaboration with the UK's Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office.



For more than ten years, I've remained deeply connected to the UK and the British Embassy. That connection comes from genuine appreciation and gratitude. Whenever I reach out to UK partners, I am taken seriously. I feel heard, seen, and supported.

She has also expanded NATO Ukraine programme funding from a single UK donor to four international contributors, multiplying the reach and sustainability of UK expertise in Ukraine.

Finally, Olesia has co-founded a Ukrainian NGO that works with multiple government ministries to support vulnerable groups and strengthen social cohesion in preparation for Ukraine's longer-term post-war recovery.

Development for inclusive societies

Anelize Lenzi Ruas de Almeida



Country: Brazil

Title: Attorney General's Office for the National Treasury (under President Luiz Inácio Lula da Silva)

UK institution: University of Oxford, Public Policy, 2019

Anelize has played a central role in strengthening Brazil's fiscal governance, helping to position the Attorney General's Office for the National Treasury as a key contributor to economic policymaking.

She has led major legal and fiscal reforms, including:

- Introducing a new fiscal framework to keep Brazil's government borrowing at safe, manageable levels over the long term
- Advancing tax reform by introducing a value-added tax to make the tax system fairer, simpler and more sustainable
- Shaping Brazil's response to global trade pressures, including tariffs imposed by the United States
- Supporting the **ecological transformation plan**, which encourages changes in the economy to support sustainable development
- Supporting economic transformation initiatives affecting activity representing around 30% of GDP

In 2025 alone, Anelize's work contributed to the recovery of over R\$68 billion in outstanding tax liabilities.



Without Chevening, my civil service career would have been a much more conventional and restricted one - one in which I would have passed up opportunities.

Exposure to people from different cultural and political backgrounds enhanced my ability to consider other perspectives and move up to senior leadership roles.

Doors began to open for me after Chevening.

Her leadership is helping to strengthen Brazil's economic stability, legal clarity, and institutions in one of the UK's key Latin American partners, making it a more predictable place for international collaboration and investment.

Security and stability

Vivek Yadav



Country: India

Title: Director for IT and Cyber Security at India's Ministry of Defence

UK institution: Cranfield University, Chevening India Cyber Security Fellowship, 2023

Drawing on expertise and international relationships developed through the Chevening India Cyber Security Fellowship at Cranfield University, Vivek Yadav is helping to shape India's digital and AI agenda, and reinforcing opportunities for deeper collaboration between the UK and India on cyber resilience and emerging technologies.

By engaging with UK experts including the Global Cyber Security Capacity Centre at the University of Oxford and the UK Defence Cyber Agency, the fellowship strengthened his approach to working strategically with international partners on cyber security policy and AI governance.

For example, since returning home Vivek has contributed to national discussions on India's AI infrastructure and digital security, including as a panellist at the India AI Impact Summit, where he contributed to discussions on shared security challenges and the importance of secure, resilient and responsibly governed national AI capabilities. He also led the development and implementation of a comprehensive governance, risk, and compliance framework to strengthen resilience against evolving cyber security threats.



Relationships that would typically take years to build only took months, thanks to the Chevening network.

Chevening did not simply expand my horizons. It raised my sense of obligation to put that expanded perspective to work in service of something larger than my own career trajectory.

Vivek continues to collaborate with the contacts he made in the UK as part of his Chevening Fellowship, including researchers and faculty members at Cranfield University's Shrivenham campus, who provide ongoing insight into emerging technologies in the cyber security field.

I have experienced for myself, both as a Chevening Board member and also as Head of FCDO's Pakistan Group, just how impactful Chevening is.

For example, Chevening alumna Maha Kamal is championing women's leadership in Pakistan's clean energy transition, strengthening UK-Pakistan collaboration in sustainable energy.

Through the Chevening Climate Mentoring Scheme UK-trained Chevening alumni are also mentoring young climate professionals in Pakistan, building technical skills and policy insight that supports climate resilience.

Alumni go on to serve in senior roles including as Chief Commissioner of Islamabad, Additional Secretary for Climate Finance, and senior members of the judiciary.

Chevening Scholars build lasting UK connections through their academic studies, Chevening events, and professional networks fostered by the programme. These experiences shape positive perceptions of UK culture and values, which they carry into their careers, strengthening future collaboration with the UK on shared global challenges.

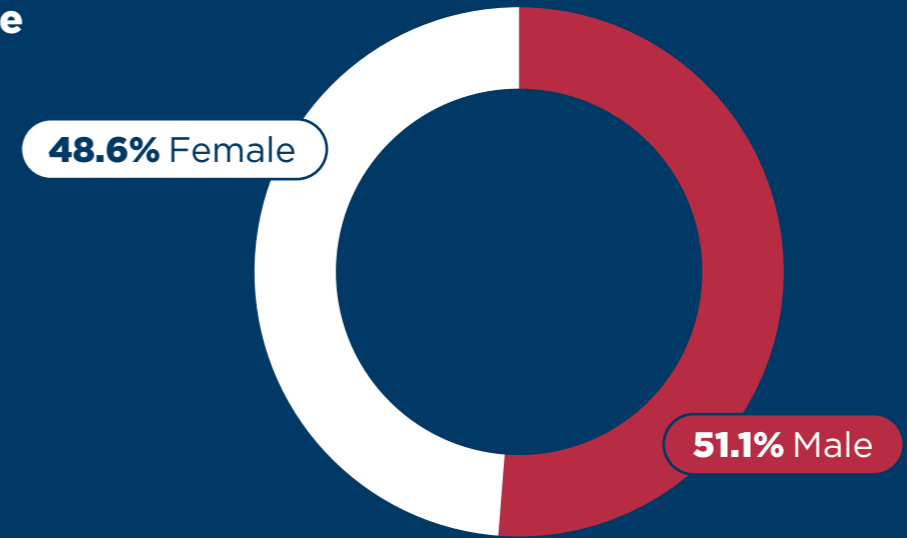

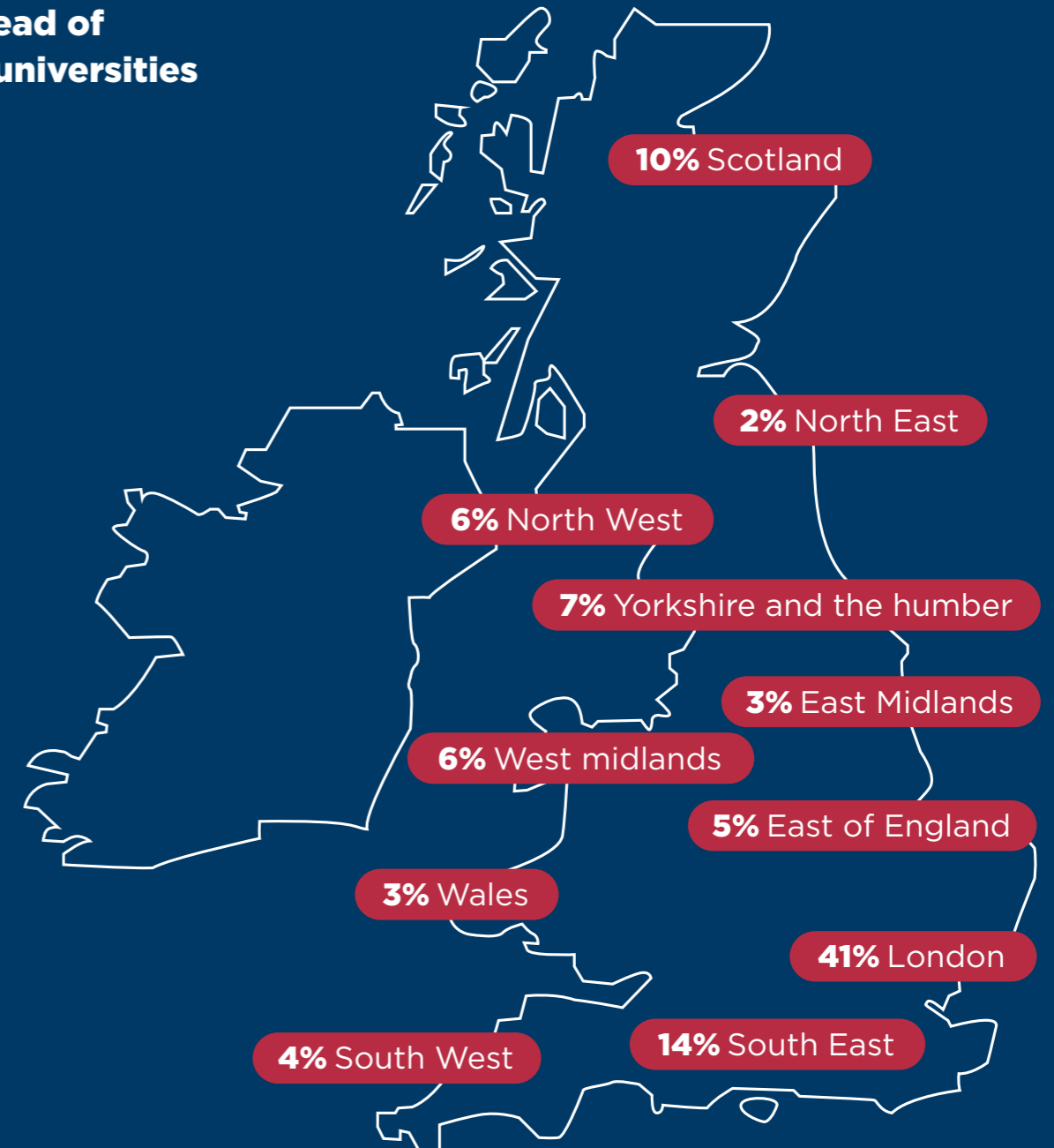

Oleksiy Povolotskiy

Country: Ukraine

Title: Head of the Office for Energy Infrastructure Recovery, DTEK

UK institution: University of Leicester, Comparative Policing and Social Conflict, 1998



Oleksiy is leading efforts to restore and modernise Ukraine's energy infrastructure, ensuring electricity and heat for more than 20 million households affected by the ongoing conflict.

As Head of the Office for Energy Infrastructure Recovery and Modernisation at DTEK, the largest private investor in the energy sector of Ukraine, he secures critical equipment and financing to repair damaged facilities and drive long-term upgrades needed to strengthen Ukraine's energy resilience and support stable energy supplies across Europe. His work has helped sustain the energy sector despite more than \$100 billion in damage.

'Our goal is not just to rebuild the infrastructure, but to build modern electricity generation and grids that will meet challenging needs of future society.'

Drawing on the skills, knowledge, and networks gained through Chevening, Oleksiy has built partnerships with UK energy companies and equipment manufacturers, including EDF UK and DIRECTX, securing technical support essential for restoring damaged infrastructure.

He has also developed relationships with UK organisations, including the Department for Business and Trade (DBT) and the Ukraine Britain Business Council (UBBC). He is keen to expand collaboration through initiatives like Innovate Ukraine, and support partnerships that strengthen UK-Ukraine ties and enhance national and regional energy security.
